

Eno River Association Land Protection & Stewardship Funds

The Eno River Association provides donors an opportunity to designate their gifts to support the conservation, protection, and stewardship of land along the Eno River through the following restricted funds:



Allen Lloyd Fund for the Upper Eno

This memorial fund was created by the Eno River Association Board of Directors in honor of Allen Lloyd. Distributions are designated for the purchase and stewardship of land in the upper part of the Eno River watershed, mainly Orange County and upstream of Hillsborough, NC.



The Confluence Fund

Created by the Eno River Association Board of Directors, the Confluence Fund allows donors to give funds solely for the maintenance, management, and improvement of the Confluence Natural Area including education programs, facilities, and property improvement projects.



Conservation Land Stewardship Endowment Fund

Endowed funds that support the stewardship and maintenance of all of our Eno-owned properties, this fund helps cover monitoring and conservation property easement defense needs as well as any legal defense of rights under an easement or other property rights.



Margaret Nygard

Margaret C. Nygard Land Acquisition Fund

Named in honor of the Eno River Association founder, this memorial fund is our primary land acquisition fund. Supporting purchasing of property and conservation easements along the Eno River, this fund is unrestricted for use in land acquisition and contains donations designated for this specific fund.

Roberta & Herman Brown Land Preservation Fund

Established in 2020, this fund supports acquisition of land & conservation easements in Orange County, as well as the expansion or maintenance of these lands. This fund was established through a nearly \$2 million bequest from the estate of Joyce Brown, daughter of Roberta & Herman.
